1. Student Intake

Division of Health Sciences:

Up to a maximum of 10 students in total for the Division (the Doctoral Degree Program in Health Sciences and the Doctoral Degree Program in Nursing)

- 1) We are open to all applications from working adult applicants in Japan and overseas student applicants for the above enrollment limit of 10.
- 2) Applicants shall be advised to contact a faculty member of their desired field of research(see appended list at the end of these guidelines) to discuss research projects before applying.

3. Application Requirements

Home Student Applicants

You must meet one of the requirements 1) – 8) below.

- 1) Applicants who have been awarded a master's degree or professional degree (the term "professional degree" when used hereinafter shall refer to the professional degree prescribed in Article 5-2 of the *Academic Degree Rules* (Ordinance of the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture, No. 9 of 1953) under the provision in Article 104, Paragraph 1 of the *School Education Act*). They include those to be awarded one of the aforementioned degrees before enrolling in a doctoral degree program.
- 2) Applicants who have completed a program run by the United Nations University and have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree. They include those who are to be awarded the said degree before enrolling in a doctoral degree program.
- 3) Applicants who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or professional degree from a university outside Japan. They include those who are to be awarded the

said degree before enrollment in a doctoral degree program.

- 4) Applicants who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or professional degree by taking courses through correspondence from an overseas institute while living in Japan. They include those who are to be awarded the said degree prior to enrollment in a doctoral degree program.
- 5) Applicants who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or professional degree after completion of a graduate program of an educational institute in Japan which is accredited to offer graduate programs of an overseas graduate school under the school education system of the country concerned and is also designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. The eligible applicants include those who are to be awarded the said degree prior to enrollment in a doctoral degree program.
- 6) Applicants who have completed an education program at an overseas institute, the institute designated as described in 5) or the United Nations University, have passed an examination and assessment equivalent to those prescribed in Article 16-2 of the *Standards for Establishment of Graduate Schools* and have gained or are expected to gain by March 2027 the academic competence equivalent or superior to that of a master's degree holder.
- 7) Applicants designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Ministerial announcement No. 118, Ministry of Education, Science and Culture, 1989) to whom either A or B below applies.
 - A. Bachelor's degree holders with research work experience of 2 years or more at universities or research institutes who have the academic competence equivalent or superior to that of a master's degree holder as having had their research outcomes reviewed by the Graduate School of Health Sciences.
 - B. Persons who:
 - Have their 16-year school education completed in overseas countries or have their 16-year school education of overseas countries completed by taking courses through correspondence from overseas institutes while living in Japan;
 - Have gained two years or more research work experience at universities or research institutes after completion of the above education; and
 - Have academic competence equivalent to or superior to that of a master's degree holder as having had their research outcomes reviewed by the Graduate School of Health Sciences.
- 8) Applicants who are 24 years of age or older as of March 31, 2027, with academic competence equivalent or superior to that of a master's/professional degree holder based on the assessment "9. Application Review for Qualification Approval" by the Graduate School of Health Sciences.*

*Applicable to non-degree holders who graduated from a polytechnic/technical college, junior/two-year college, specialized training college, other type of school (vocational school), overseas university's satellite college in Japan or school for foreign nationals in Japan.

Note:

Applicants who fall into 7) or 8) in "3. Application Requirements" must go through an application review for qualification approval before applying for a doctoral degree program. Read "9. Application Review for Qualification Approval".

Working Adult Applicants

Applicants who stay on their job after their enrollment in a doctoral program must meet one of the application requirements for “Home Student Applicants” above and have specialized work experience in healthcare (in all aspects), public health or at welfare facilities, research institutes, educational institutes, government offices or corporates at the time of making an application. Special Measures in the delivery of education under Article 14 of the *Standards for Establishment of Graduate Schools* are available for those who gained admission through the “Working Adult Applicants” screening to facilitate their university studies.

cf. Article 14 of the *Standards for Establishment of Graduate Schools* (excerpt from the Ordinance of the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture No. 28 of 1974)

Article 14 When deemed particularly necessary for the education in a graduate degree program, graduate students may be offered education in a feasible manner such as the delivery of classes and research supervision during night-time hours, specific hours or specific periods.

Overseas Student Applicants

Applicants must meet one of the application requirements listed 3) to 6), 7) B and 8) under “Home Student Applicants”.

And also,

- Applicants hoping for a MEXT (Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) scholarship: The scholarship application may require a “letter of consent for acceptance”. The applicant must directly contact a faculty member in his/her desired field of study and request prior consent for acceptance. Upon unofficial approval of the consent, ask the faculty to organize and sign a letter of consent for acceptance.
- Applicants who are self-supported: You must obtain a “recommendation letter from supervising faculty” from a faculty member of your desired field of study.

4. How to Apply

1) Admissions Window (starting date, closing date & time):

From Thursday, July 9 to Thursday, July 16, 2026

Office open: 8:30 am to 5:00 pm (Japan Standard Time. Closed Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays)

Submit the documents listed in 4. 2) in person, or by post to the address in 4. 3) (send by “Kakitome-Sokutatsu” (insured registered express mail) via Japan Post, or its equivalent from overseas). **The closing date must be strictly observed.**

Application Procedure for Overseas Student Applicants

Please note that your application will not be accepted unless you complete the following **Steps 1-3**.

Step 1. Apply Online.

[The webpage below is accessible from Monday, July 6 JST]

This is to allow enough time to have your international mail delivered to us before the admission window closes.

- i) Send an email to kyomu@hs.hokudai.ac.jp to obtain the password to access “HOKKAIDO UNIVERSITY Graduate School of Health Sciences Online Application”

In your email, please indicate whether you are applying for a master’s or doctoral degree program, and provide the name of the faculty member who gave you prior consent for acceptance.

- ii) Go to the above Online Application website “HOKKAIDO UNIVERSITY Graduate School of Health Sciences Online Application”.

Note:

- Go through the instructions and reminders before making an application. On the top page, click “English” then click “Introduction” to read.
 - You need a printer and a contact email address (the one provided by your mobile/cell phone company is not acceptable) through the procedure to make an application, print out the necessary documents and later receive an automatic email notification of payment for the admission exam.
- iii) Follow the on-screen instructions to select the option applicable to you or enter the necessary information.
 - iv) When you have completed the procedure, you will receive an application completion email at your registered e-mail address.

Step 2. Pay your Admissions Exam Fee.

(Exemption applies to the overseas students on the MEXT scholarship)

- i) When you have completed the online application procedure, continue to the payment page. Use one of the following payment methods.

A. Credit card

Enter your credit card number, expiration date, cardholder’s name and security code.

B. Pay-easy (using a bank ATM, Japan Post Bank ATM or its online banking service), convenience store or internet banking (PayPay Bank or Rakuten Bank)

a) Pay-easy ATM

Make a note of the payment code (Pay-easy payee number), application number (remitter number) and confirmation number issued after you select a payment institution. Take the note with you to the above payment institution when making your payment at a Pay-easy ATM.

b) Convenience store

Make a note of the application number (remitter number), and the confirmation number or online payment number, issued after you select a payment institution. Take the note with you to the convenience store you selected when you make your payment (there is a list of convenience stores with in-store payment services to pay your Admissions Exam Fee – see our Online Application website).

c) PayPay Bank/Rakuten Bank

Follow the instructions shown on the screen.

C. Payments via the China Union Pay network “China Union Pay”

Type in your bank account number, expiration date, password and other information required on the UnionPay payment page to complete payment.

- ii) The required information and the procedures may vary by financial institution. Read the on-screen instructions carefully before making payment.

A handling fee of 500 yen will apply on top of the Admissions Exam Fee of 30,000 yen when you make the admissions exam fee payment.

Note:

The applicants who reside overseas at the time of application and are unable to pay by credit card or China Union Pay should ask a person in Japan to pay on their behalf using the above method A or B.

Step 3. Submit the required documents in person or by post.

i) Hand in or send by post your completed application form generated upon completion of the online application process, along with all other required documents within the application period. Affix one of the postal address labels printed out with the application form to an envelope if sent by post. The closing date must be strictly observed.

ii) **The application process will be complete when all required documents have been received by our Administrative Office (see 4. 3). Please be advised that your application will not be complete if you have gone through the online application process but have not submitted any hard copy documents to us.**

6	TOEFL-iBT Official Score Report	We only accept the original hard copy of the result of the TOEFL-iBT taken within two years before the doctoral admissions exam month (August 2026). DO NOT submit scores from TOEFL-ITP or TOEIC. Not required if you have enrolled in one of the master’s degree programs of the Graduate School of Health Sciences in AY2014 or after.

10	Proof of payment form	Fill in your name on the form and attach "Kentei-ryo uketsuke shomei-sho" (the validated portion of the bank transfer form stamped by the post office or bank upon payment of the examination fee) where indicated on the "proof of payment form".
11	Self-addressed stamped envelope	Write your name and address with your postcode and attach a 110 yen postage stamp on a bound-in envelope (small envelope) included in the back of the application guidelines (printed edition). (We will send you your examination admission card at a later date.)
12	Mailing label	Use a prescribed sticker label sheet. Write your name and address with your postcode on two prescribed labels. We will use them to send you your exam results in September 2026 and admission documents in February 2027. 13	Photocopy of residence card or equivalent	Foreign residents in Japan should submit a photocopy of their residence card or an equivalent certificate which verifies their resident status.

Working Adult Applicants

Working adult applicants must submit the following documents in addition to those required of the home student applicants listed above.

14	Letter of approval to study at Hokkaido University (shugaku shodaku-sho)	Use a prescribed form. Must be issued by the head of the department of the organization you work for.
15	Certificate of employment stating the duration of employment (zaishoku kikan shoumei-sho)	A document verifying your job title and the period of employment (format not specified). Not required if you have already submitted a copy through the "Application Review for Qualification Approval" process.

Overseas Student Applicants

Overseas Student Applicants must submit the following documents within the application period.

1	Admissions application form (Nyugaku gansho)	Complete the online form and print out the admissions application form in A4 (this includes your academic CV details). Attach an ID photo (in size 40mm × 30mm, face-to-shoulder shot with no hat and no background, taken within the last three months) to the form.
2	Examination admission card (juken hyo) and photo card (shashin hyo)	Attach an ID photo (in size 40mm x 30 mm, face-to-shoulder shot with no hat and no background taken within the last three months) on the examination admission card and photo card printed out with the admissions application form. Print your name on the back of the photos.
3	Recommendation letter (suisen sho)	A recommendation letter from the head of your affiliated department at your workplace or the principal or faculty of the educational institute from which you gained your highest educational qualification/attainment. The letter has to be an original document (not scanned or photocopied) signed by the issuer of the letter in original handwriting (electronic signature not accepted) or officially stamped by the issuing institute.

5) Important Reminders

- i) We do not accept incomplete applications. Check written errors and incomplete information in the required forms.
- ii) You cannot make any changes to your application once accepted. We will not return your application documents.
- iii) We send an examination admission card (juken hyo) to those whose application is accepted in early August. Please let us know at kyomu@hs.hokudai.ac.jp if you have not received the card by August 12.
- iv) Falsified information in your application documents can lead to cancellation of admission.
- v) Submit documentary proof such as an extract of the family register if any of your names have changed from those on your degree certificates (e.g. change in surnames).
- vi) When you send your application documents by post from within Japan, use the bound-in envelope to this application guidelines brochure (large envelope) and send by “kakitome sokutatsu” (insured registered express mail). Use the same envelope if you hand in your documents at our office in the Graduate School.
- vii) If you need to apply for extended enrollment as described in “10. Extended Enrollment”, you must email us at kyomu@hs.hokudai.ac.jp to request an application form for extended

enrollment and submit it with other required documents at the time of admissions application.
viii) There is no refund of the admissions exam fee paid under any circumstances except for the following.

- a. You paid the admissions exam fee but did not make an application for a degree program; or your application documents were incomplete and not accepted. ||
- b. You paid a duplicate admissions exam fee. ||

|| Ask Academic Affairs, Administrative Office, Graduate School of Health Sciences for a refund. Must allow a reasonable period for the process of refund. Keep the receipt “Kentei-ryo uketsuke shomei-sho” (examination fee payment certificate - the validated portion of the bank transfer form stamped by the post office or bank upon payment of the examination fee) or “Furikae haraikomi seikyu-sho ken juryou-sho” (same as the said certificate) which you will be asked to present to receive your refund.

5. Admissions Criteria and Methods

The selection of home student applicants and working adult applicants comprehensively considers the oral exam assessment and the review of applicants’ submitted documents. Meanwhile, we conduct only the document review on the admissions of overseas students. The assessment determines which candidates receive places according to the applicants’ ranking in the admission review as remarked above. The score of the last place offered under the admission criteria will be deemed as the minimum passing level.
